The Okanagan-Kootenay Sterile Insect Release Program (OKSIR) helps reduce pesticide use in the Okanagan by controlling the key insect pest of apple and pears using the Sterile Insect Technique. This technique requires us to rear the pest in a factory by the millions, sterilize them with gamma radiation, and then release the sterile insects into orchards where they mate with the wild pest population—matings between wild and sterile insects do not produce viable offspring.
